ANTICIPATION OF THE CROWN

INTRODUCTION

- I. Virtually <u>every</u> prince or princess of royalty lives in anticipation of the time of coronation as king or queen.
 - A. Yet the GREATEST crown is available to every child of God.
 - B. Paul speaks of his anticipation of that crown. 2 Tim. 4:6-8
 - 1. Paul was in prison for his faith in Jesus.
 - 2. He expected the sacrifice of his life, but he looked forward to the appearance of the Lord, the righteous judge.

II. In this anticipation, Paul speaks of his PAST, PRESENT and FUTURE—in this passage.

I. 1st, Paul speaks of his VICTORIOUS PAST.

A. He alludes to his having been a **soldier**, in that he fought a good fight. v. 7

- 1. Paul's ministry was a WAR he FOUGHT against evil. 1 Cor. 15:32; 2 Cor. 10:3-4
 - 2. Paul's fight was a GOOD fight, as he was on God's side. v. 7; 1 Tim. 6:12
- B. Paul <u>also</u> alludes to his being a **runner**, in tht he had completed the course set before him. v. 7; 1 Cor. 9:24, 26; Heb. 12:1
- C. Paul <u>then a</u>lludes to his having been a faithful **steward** of the gospel. v. 7; Acts 20:16-27; Gal. 1:8; Jude 23; 1 Cor. 4:2

II. 2nd, Paul speaks of his PEACEFUL PRESENT.

- A. He was "ready" (or willing) to be offered <u>as</u> a **sacrifice** on the altar. v. 6
- B. Paul looked upon this offering <u>as</u> a time of his **"departure"** from the ports of this life, to set sail into eternity. v. 6; Phil. 1:21-23; 2 Cor. 5:8-10

III, 3rd, Paul speaks of a BLISSFUL FUTURE.

A. In the 1st place, he speaks of something "laid up" for him. v.8; cf Col.1:5; 1 Pet. 1:3-4

- B. In the 2nd place, he speaks of that which **"awaits"** him—a crown of righteousness the final reward.
 - 1. There are 2 words in the Greek language for the English word "crown."
 - a. 1st, the Greek word <u>diadema</u>, signifying **kingly or imperial dignity.**
 - b. 2nd, the Greek word <u>stephanos</u>, signifying the **victor's crown**, the crown of gold given after a race of some kind.
 - 2. The <u>stephanos</u> is used **HERE** as in other places which describes the crown of eternal life Christ will give at His return. 1 Cor. 9:25; 1 Pet. 5:4; Jas. 1:12; Rev. 2:10
 - a. It is a crown of righteousness, given by the "righteous" judge. 2 Tim. 4:8

b. It is a crown given to those who love His appearing by righteous living. v. 8 CONCLUSION

- I. This crown will be given to Paul and ALL that "love His appearing" in the last day by being in becoming a Christian and remaining faithful to His word. John 14:15; 1 John 5:3
- II. Have you been obedient to His word?
