GOD'S MORAL LAW FOR MARRIAGE, DIVORCE AND REMARRIAGE

"Because God planned all things in the scheme of redemption before the creation of the world (Rom. 14:25-26; Eph. 3:8-13; Tit. 1:2-3), this means that before "the beginning" He made provisions for marriage, divorce and remarriage. Then, in Genesis 2, with the creation of man and woman, God set forth His one moral law for marriage and the home that has continued through all biblical ages. Hence, <u>God's Moral Law for All Biblical Ages.</u>

IN view of any correctness in the above statements:

- 1) Why does he attempt to now show that WE are NOT under Matt. 19 today?
- 2) BUT, Moses "suffered" a <u>departure</u> from God's Moral Law, and Christ is calling us BACK to it in Matthew 19.
- 3) If God's moral law has not changed, WE are bound by the SAME teaching as Matt. 19:9, for it is linked to God's will from THE BEGINNING.

MATT. 19:9 ("Put away (except for fornication)..marrieth another..committeth adultery.")
MARK 10:11,12 ("Put away......marrieth another..committeth adultery.")
ROM. 7:3 ("Husband lives.....marrieth another..called an adulteress.")

NOTE

- (1) Rom. 7 appears to be STRICTER than Matthew and Mark.
 - a. Exception of "fornication" not stated.
 - b. Exception not pertinent to full subject dealt with in Matthew and Mark.
- (2) Rom. 7 is unquestionably N.T. doctrine.
- (3) Rom. 7 harmonizes with Matthew and Mark—no contradiction.
- (4) All 3 passages are IN the same New Testament.
