HILLEL / SHAMMAI

"On this the school of Hillel amoung the rabbins put the interpretation that a man might divorce hiswife for any unbecomingness, or indeed for any cause, as the Pharisees in our Lord's day taught (Matt. Xix.3). The school of Shammai, on the other hand, taught that only for something disgraceful, such as adultery, could a wife be divorced. Adultery, however, cannot be supposed here because that was punishable with death."
