QUOTATIONS

“Perhaps it would be helpful for everyone to realize that when Jesus was teaching and quoting the Old Testament law of Moses, he did not quote Moses and the prophets verbatim—that is, word for word.” (Billingsly, AND I SAY UNTO YOU, p. 5, par. 2)

DAN'S PIT

“Let it be known that 'ervah' is used 'only twice' in the entire Old Testament law of Moses. Once in Deuteronomy 23:14...and once in Deuteronomy 24:1.”

Dan Billingsly, (THE DEVIL & MATTHEW 19, p. 16).

Deut. 23:14 - - - - leaving human waste uncovered

Deut. 24:1 - - - - - some form of uncleanness

“Christ settles all arguments as in to the meaning of 'ervah' with his definition and cause for divorce in Israel as 'fornication' or 'adultery'.”

Dan Billingsly, (THE DEVIL & MATTHEW 19, p. 16)

NOTE:

1) Was “leaving human waste uncovered” really “FORNICATION?”

2) If Christ settled the matter by saying ervah WAS “fornication”, then leaving waste uncovered WAS INDEED “fornication” and grounds for divorce.

3) WHY let Matt. 19:9 interpret one passage and NOT the other????

4) If ervah is NOT “fornication” in Deut. 23:14, HOW does Dan KNOW it is such in Deut. 24:17?

5) Does Dan not know the difference between leaving human waste uncovered and illicit sexual relations?

O.T. WORDS FOR "IMMORALITY"

- (1) TUMAH - 37 times - Def. Impurity: filthiness, unclean. Used in reference to fornication.
- (2) ZANUWN - 11 times - Def. Adultery; Fig. Idolatry: whoredom.
- (3) ZANAH - 108 times - Def. To commit adultery; Fig. To commit idolatry.
- (4) NAAPH - 48 times - Def. To commit adultery; Fig. To apostatize
- (5) TAZNAWTH - 21 times - Def. harlotry, fornication; Fig. Idolatry.
- (6) TAME - 246 times - Def. To be foul: defile, pollute

TOTAL - 471 times - ALL relate to immorality or fornication.

"ERVAH", on the other hand, is not used one single time to refer to "fornication"

-found 54 times in 40 verses.

-Def. Nakedness; fig. Disgrace, shame, blemish.

The SEPTUIGANT Translation (Greek OT by 70 Heb. & Greek scholars)

NEVER translated "ervah" as "fornication" or its equivalent.
