"HE IS A NEW CREATURE"

INTRODUCTION

The Bible refers to GOD as the creator of (1) The UNIVERSE; (2) The HUMAN RACE; and (3) ALL THINGS that are good. Gen. 1:1, 31. Then, God rested from His creation. Gen. 2:1-3. This could rightfully be called the "first creation"--the creation of material things. Because Satan interfered with God's creation, God was ready to work His plan of redemption by a "second creation"--that of the church and His offer of salvation to fallen man.

The New Testament speaks of this by referring to God's **creation** of new **creatures**, **create**d by Hiim. In this lesson, we are going make a study of some verses in the New Testament dealing with these words.

DISCUSSION

I. 1st, let's examine the verses REFERRING TO GOD'S NEW CREATION.

A. Saved individuals are <u>called</u> "new creatures". 2 Cor. 5:17; Gal. 6:15

- 1. Both passages tell us **where** we are "new creatures"--IN Christ Jesus.
- 2. This means we need to GET into Christ, to BE in Him <u>as</u> new creatures. Rom. 6:3; Gal. 3:26-27
- B. The whole process of redemption is the **working** of God. Eph. 2:8
 - 1. His working plan involves "believing". John 6:28-29
 - 2. His working plan also involves "baptism", which completes the process of making us new creatures, when we are born again. Col. 2:12; cf John 3:5, 7
 - a. God's word, given by the "Spirit" is the **seed** for begetting in the new birth process. Luke 8:11; Jas. 1:18
 - b. Then, the "water" is the element of **baptism** (or immersion) which
 - completes the process, bringing forth "new creatures." Mark 16:15-16
 - 1) This passage speaks of the "gospel", which IS that seed.
 - 2) Then, the working of "believing" and "baptism" describes the first and last actions of the one being born again.
 - c. At this point, the "new life" AS "new creatures, BEGINS, since the old man of sin has died and been buried, with a new creature emerging. Rom.6:5-6

II. 2nd, let's see what is EXPECTED OF NEW CREATURES.

- A. Primarily, what GOD expects of new creatures is most important, for it is HIM that we must please.
 - 1. God expects new creatures to **leave** behind the old sinful life of the past, and to put Him and His kingdom first and foremost. Matt. 6:33; 1 Pet. 4:1-3 (study as desired)
 - 2. Then, God expects new creatures to **grow** spiritually, just as a baby born into a human family is expected to grow. 1 Pet. 2:2; 2 Pet. 3:18
 - 3. God expects new creatures to **teach** others (privately or in the work of the church) to help them to become new creatures also. Heb. 5;12-14
 - 4. God also expects new creatures to **worship** Him, especially on the first day of each week. Acts 2:42; 20:7
 - 5. God expects new creatures to maintain **faithfulness** to Him—II the days of their lives. 1 Cor. 15:58
- B. Then, what OTHERS expect of new creatures is also important.
 - 1. Other Christians expect new creatures to set a good example and live their new life as those who have given a commitment to God. 1 Tim. 4:12

- 2. Some in the world MAY think new creatures are "*strange*", for no longer doing what THEY do, and what the new creatures once did. 1 Pet. 4:4
- C. Finally, what new creatures think of themselves is VERY important.
 - 1. New creatures have the will and desire to live right from their beginning, with their sights set on eternal life in heaven. Tit. 2:11-13
 - 2. New creatures cannot help but desiring to learn more about the Bible, and being excited about being Christians, to glorify God. 1 Pet. 4:16; Matt. 5:16; Eph. 2:10; 3:21
 - 3. New creatures should seek to engage in a private reading of the scriptures, and a desire to be present in every Bible class of the church, with a realization that something may be learned in any one session, that will help them to avoid sin and it's consequences, and to ultimately live in heaven.

CONCLUISION

- I. When one is first baptized, he or she **becomes** "a new creature" IN CHRIST, and will always strive to be a new creature, as a part of God's new creation.
 - A. The opportunity to become a new creature is yours today, if you are willing to confess your faith in Jesus, repent of sins, and be baptized for the remission of sins.
 - B. IF you, AS a "new creature", have turned back into sin and need the prayers of the church here, you have the opportunity to make it known
