SEEING THE UNSEEN

Intro.

- I. The title of our lesson today is "Seeing the Unseen". Cf 2Cor.4:17f
 - A. There are 3 types of vision today.
 - 1. Being "near sighted" is being able to see things nearby CLEARLY, and not clearly seeing things in the distance.
 - 2. Being "far sighted" being able to see things afar off CLEARLY, and not not clearly seeing things that are nearby.
 - 3. GOOD vision is being able to CLEARLY see both those things nearby and afar off—having a good perspective of all things.
 - B. We <u>must</u> the things nearby (things of the world), while also, and most importantly, seeing the things afar off (the things of eternity—**clearly.**
- II. Now let's make a study of the things "seen" and the things "unseen".
 - A. In this text, the things <u>that</u> are "seen" refers to things we see with out two physical eyes, while the things "unseen" are those things we should be seeing with the "eyes of faith". Cf He.11:1
 - B. The things "seem" seem to catch the most attention of most people, while the "unseen" things are not observed.
 - 1. Some cannot see things eternal because they are blinded to the truth revealed in the Scripture. 2Co.4:3f; cf Mt.7:13f
 - 2. Some can't see the eternal city, much less the way to it, or the gate to enter into that city.

Dissussion

I. 1st, things "seen" are in 2 general categories.

- A. The first category is that of **TREASURES** (or riches or material possessions). Lk.12:15-21; Mt.6:19-21; Js.4:1-3; He.11:16; Lk.16:19-34...
- B. The second category is that of **PLEASURES** (or things that emphasize enjoyment and excitement.
 - 1. One can be so engulfed in *innocent* OR *good* pleasures that he can lose sight of the eternal city. Eccl.1:1-11; 1Ti.5:6; 2Ti.3:1-5; Lk.8:14;1Pe.1:9-11....
 - 2. Many are so engulfed in <u>sinful</u> pleasures that they are dead in sin, and these pleasures are ALL they want. 2Sa.11:1-27; Mt.5:28; 2Pe.2:14; He.11:25

II. 2nd, things "unseen" are several in number.

- A. 1st of all, GOD must be seen. Ro.1:20; He.11:26f
- B. 2ndly, CHRIST must be seen. Mt.14:22-30; He.12:1f
 - 1. HE is the One who redeems us from sin. 1Pe.1:18f
 - 2. HE is the One who tells us what do do to BE redeemed from our sins. Mk.16:15f
- C. 3rdly, the POWER of the GOSPEL must be seen. Ro.1:16f
- D. 4thly, the SECOND COMING of Christ must be seen. Ac.1:9-11;
- E. 5thly, HEAVEN itself must be seen—by faith. 2Pe.3:12,13,14
- I. WHY look to the "unseen" beyond the "seen"?
 - A. Basically, for a better life here and the hope of heaven.
 - B. Ultimately, for a realization of our hope, and the eternal enjoyment of every thing beyond the things "seen" here.
- II. Exhortation.
