

THAT YE SHOULD FOLLOW HIS STEPS, Three

INTRODUCTION

In 2 previous lessons, we looked at the context of 1 Pet. 2:21, where Peter said that Jesus suffered for us, leaving us an example that we should follow His steps. We looked at the ORIGIN of His suffering, WHY He suffered, and HOW we are to share in that suffering. In a second lesson, we looked at some of the STEPS Jesus took, in which we can also step. This involved the Jordan of BAPTISM, the wilderness of TEMPTATION, the temple of WORSHIP, and the highway of SERVICE. In this lesson we shall conclude the series by looking at 4 additional steps Jesus took, in which we can take. These things all pertain to the **future** of our lives that we need to consider.

DISCUSSION

I. 1st, we shall follow Jesus' steps in the VALLEY OF DEATH.

- A. David refers to **his** and **our** going through the valley of the shadow of death. Ps. 23:4
 - 1. Death is a shadow because it is **temporary** and **fleeting**. Job 14:1-2
 - 2. Death is like a shadow in that we enter a state where we are caught between the **past** and the **eternal future**. Job 8:9
- B. Christ has gone before, and has experienced death, and be with us as we enter this valley. Ps. 23:4
 - 1. Christ died physically so we who also died physically will **not** have to die eternally. Heb. 2:9
 - 2. Christians die "in the Lord," and do not think of physical death as the end of our existence. Matt. 10:28; Rev. 14:13

II. 2nd, we shall follow Jesus' steps in the GARDEN OF THE RESURRECTION.

- A. Jesus was raised from the tomb in a garden, to confirm that **He** was indeed the Son of God who had **foretold** His own resurrection. Matt. 16:21; Jn. 19:41-203
- B. Jesus was raised from the dead as the **first part** of the final resurrection of the dead in the last day. 1 Cor. 15:12-23

III. 3rd, we shall follow Jesus' steps in the ascension through the CLOUDS OF HEAVEN.

- A. After His resurrection, Jesus **ascended** through the clouds. Acts 1:9-11
- B. When Jesus returns, He will **not set foot** on the earth, but we shall meet Him in the **clouds** of heaven. 1 Thess. 4:13-17

IV. 4th, we shall follow Jesus' steps as we enter the joys of OF GLORY.

- A. Jesus left this life to enter into His glory, as He did so with **joy**. John 17:1-5; Heb. 12:2; Rom. 8:17-18
- B. Heaven be a place of joy and peace. Rev. 21:4; Matt. 25:21
 - 1. There'll be no cause of unhappiness in heaven. Rev. 21:4
 - 2. SONG: "No Disappointment in Heaven", by F. M. Lehman, written In 1942.
