THE ORIGIN OF THE CHURCH OF THE NEW TESTAMENT

What IS the church of the New Testament? (1) It is the one we <u>read about</u> IN the New Testament. (2) It is the one that <u>belongs to Christ</u>, and does **not** wear a name that is not even mentioned or alluded to in the New Testament. (3) It is the one <u>described</u> by the apostles of Christ, as is recorded in the New Testament. Today's lesson is the first in a series of 4 lessons, in which we shall discuss its **origin**, it's **definition**, it's **role** in God's scheme of redemption, and it's **membership**.

I. 1st, THE ORIGIN OF THE CHURCH OF CHRIST.

- A. It's origin goes back to GOD and ETERNITY.
 - 1. Though God created man sinless, He gave man a choice, and foresaw the working of Satan, and that man would someday need salvation.
 - 2. His plan for salvation involved **Christ** and the **church**.
 - a. He announced to Satan the coming of the Savior. Gen. 3:15
 - b. He planned the church, which was actually set in motion through the institution of marriage which foretold the church.
 - 1) God planned the church in eternity. Eph. 3:1-11
 - 2) The first marriage union pictured the church. Eph. 5:23-32
- B. Now let's examine a few prophecies as they relate to the the latter days, the stone, church, the kingdom, a mountain and Jerusalem. Psa. 118:22-24; 1 Pet. 2:5; 1 Tim. 3:15; Isa. 2:2-3; Gal. 6:10; Dan. 2:(1-27) 28-45; Mat. 16:18-19; 21-45; Acts 1:3.4.8; 2:1-5, 16-17, 21, (22-41, 47) (Analyze these verses carefully, and connect them with the 6 points here).
 - 1. So, the kingdom or church began in Jerusalem, as foretold.
 - 2. Those **in** the **kingdom** were and are in the **church.** Heb. 12:28; Col. 1:13; Rev.1:4,9
- C. What we have just studied tells about the **origin** of the church of the New Testament.

II. 2nd, WHAT ABOUT OTHER CHURCHES NOT "OF CHRIST"?

- A. It is documented that there are <u>now</u> over 35,000 distinct, separate denominations in the world today.
 - 1. Many of them **claim** to be churches "of Christ", but they refused to be known as such, but prefer their denominational names.
 - 2. They admit to having started in other cities than Jerusalem.
 - 3. Most have headquarters on earth (rather than heaven where Christ is, and have written creeds other than the New Testament, and rulers or heads or presidents of their denominations.
 - 4. The emphasis in many of these bodies is to create an emotional atmosphere, coupled with entertainment, and raising financial support for their operations.
 - 5. They **refuse** to adhere to the teachings of the New Testament.

- B. Their members need to be reminded of the warnings of Jesus. Mat. 15:9, 13-14
 - 1. The New Testament teaches that Christ has only **one** church.
 - 2. It's many local congregations are to teach and believe the same thing. 1 Cor. 1:10
 - 3. To teach something different is to depart from God. 2 John 9
 - 4. **THIS** church is the only one God established, and the only one that has divine right to exist, and all who desire heaven should be in **it**.
